About the Project.....

The Canadian government reviews applications to come to Canada and is granting landed immigrant status to successful Tibetan applicants, but is not providing any funding.

The Tibetan Resettlement Project Ottawa has accepted responsibility for settlement costs and family support for up to one year.

We work hand in hand with the Project Tibet Society (PTS) and the Catholic Centre for Immigrants (CCI). PTS coordinates Tibetan resettlement across Canada and prepares emigrating Tibetans before they leave India. CCI provides a host of services to new immigrants including language classes and assistance in finding employment.

Why this is important.....

The Indian government has welcomed and supports over 100,000 Tibetan refugees as best it can, but they are considered foreigners and do not have the rights of Indian citizens.

Approximately 8,000 Tibetans have lived for decades in the state of Arunachal Pradesh in northeastern India.

The Dalai Lama chose this remote area as the focus for Canada's resettlement efforts because the lives of stateless Tibetans there are especially hard.

What Tibetans need.....

Financial donations

Donations are tax receiptable and will be used for housing, medical care and food.

Housing

Temporary housing is needed for singles, married couples and families.

The newcomers must have work as soon as possible after arrival. They come with a variety of practical skills that have enabled them to become hard-working contributors to their adopted communities.

Household Items, Clothing and Food We need furniture, linens, housewares, clothing and food.
